PARISH COUNCIL

At the Council's virtual meeting, County and District Councillor Jessica Fleming outlined developments at both Councils. She also emphasised that parents who believe that their children qualify for free transport to school, and have not been contacted, should get in touch with Suffolk County Council.

The Parish Council did not increase its precept for 2021/2. The reason for the Council Tax Bills showing an increase of 2.8% is that more people have qualified for council tax reductions due to Covid19. This means that those who do not qualify must pay more.

The Council has no authority in respect of Public Rights of Way but agreed measures to attempt to ensure that the footpaths are maintained in good order. Further information about this will appear in future Newsletters.

The Parish Council owns the Village Green and is therefore responsible for its maintenance. A policy in respect of organisations who wish to use the Green was agreed. A copy of the policy will be posted on the notice board. The Clerk was asked to find out what measures might be taken to prevent damage by lorries to the village green and to report to the next meeting.

Quotations are being sought for the work of repairing the village signs.

The Annual Parish Meeting will take place on 13th May at 7.00 p.m. This is likely to be a virtual meeting, so the regular meeting of the Council on 9th September will contain an opportunity for residents to receive accounts of the Council's plans and to make comments and suggestions.
