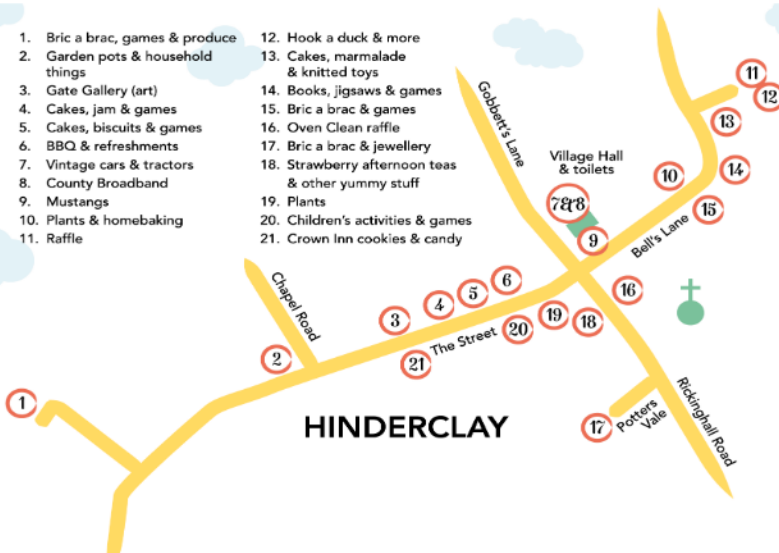

COFFEE MORNING HINDERCLAY VILLAGE HALL

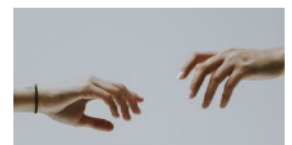

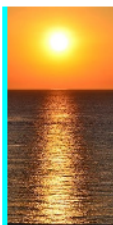
