## Parish Council News

At its meeting in November, the Members agreed the budget for 2022/3. Included in this was a sum of $£ 500$ for the Platinum Jubilee celebrations next year.

Quotations for works to both remedy the damage to the Village Green and attempt to prevent damage in the future were considered. It was agreed that further investigation was necessary.

Councillors resolved to retain the telephone box in its present position. It was stated that a member of the village has offered to clean and paint the box.

A tree is to be planted at each of the four main entrances to the village to commemorate the village's good fortune during the Covid pandemic.
Further discussion was held about the Council's role in the maintenance of footpaths. The Chairman asked for a volunteer from Members to take responsibility for this. No-one offered and the Council voted not to include matters relating to footpaths on future agendas as the Parish Council has no duty to resolve such problems.
It was agreed that the maintenance of the village's website be considered at the meeting in January.

## FOOTPATHS

Responsibility for signs and the surface of the paths is the responsibility of Suffolk County Council.

The owners of the land either side of the footpaths are responsible for trimming overhanging vegetation.

Any problem affecting a footpath should be reported to Suffolk County Council using its reporting tool which is available on its website.
