

Firstly thanks to the 12 members who braved the drizzle on our recent parish walk. Another walk is to be arranged to the west end—Hinderclay, not London.

Since our inaugural meeting in December, I have been overwhelmed by the offers of help from other green groups, not least from out immediate neighbours in Redgrave. To this end a decision has been taken to merge the two groups (Bigger and Greener). Green Redgrave in their first 12 months of operation, have forged many valuable links with local organisations, landowners and funding bodies. It kind of saves us having to re invent the wheel.

Green Redgrave have a number of interesting talks booked over the next few months and we are all cordially invited. Green Redgrave have also discussed the possibility of some field trips of wider interest. The first to go to observe the massing of wading birds at RSPB Snettisham in Norfolk. This would be later in the year.

#### **COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH** Concerns have been raised about speeding in Hinderclay and initially there has been zero response regarding volunteers to set up a speed watch scheme. The Community speed watch programme empowers communities to play an active role alongside the Safety Camera Partnership in tackling problems of speeding in their neighbourhood. As part of the Community Speed watch programme, trained volunteers verify and record the registration number of vehicles seen to be breaking the speed limit. These details are forwarded to the Safety Camera Partnership within 48 hours. A 'warning letter' is then sent to the registered owner of the vehicle, requesting them to keep their speed down. If the vehicle is seen and recorded again, a second and final letter will be sent. Persistent offenders may be targeted further. Each district has a designated Community Engagement Officer (CEO) who can provide support and assistance.

You must have a minimum of 6 volunteers All volunteers must be over 18. Each scheme must have a Co-ordinator (who will be point of contact for the team) and where possible a Deputy The Parish (or local) Council support the scheme. You will have to sign a CSW agreement and be vetted. Equipment will be provided by the constabulary. Training will be provided on using the equipment and on Health and Safety Issues Volunteers will be covered by the Constabulary's insurance.
